Hopefully, with everybody continuing to follow the rules, we will be able to take that next step on June 21st.

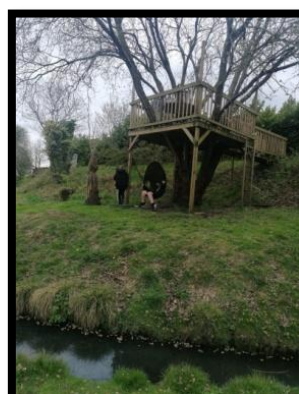

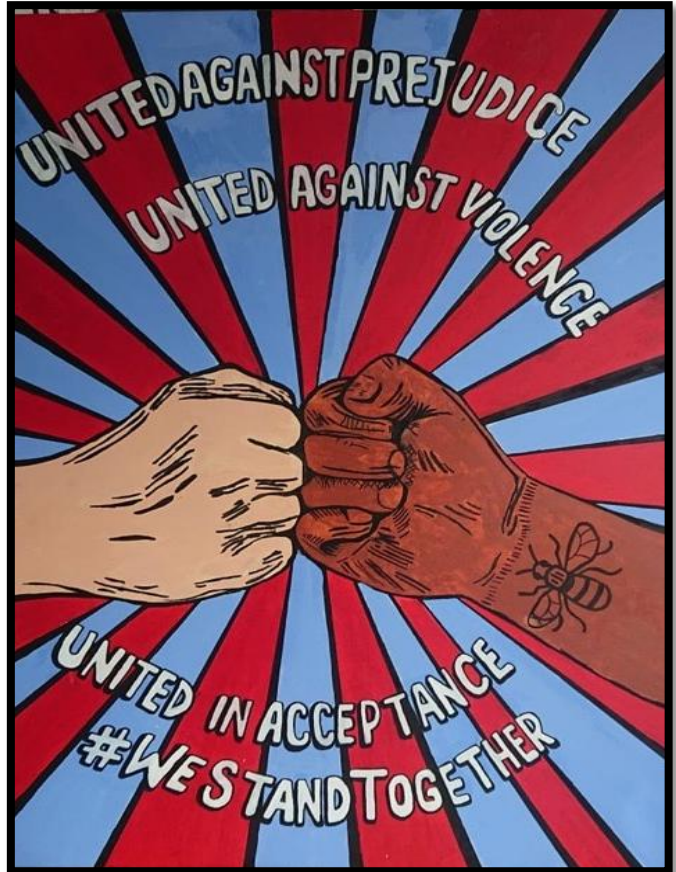
#WeStandTogether
